Biography:

"Mr. Bob" is a name synonymous with Maryland 4-H. As an extension agent in Carroll Co., a Maryland 4-H horse judging coach and the friendly person that has announced and managed the Maryland State Fair Horse Shows, Bob Shirley is a shining example of 4-H. From involvement with NAE4-HA to his work with therapeutic riding programs, Bob has left an indelible mark on 4-H. Bob began his 4-H experience in 1945 when he joined the Reisterstown Boys 4-H Club, and upon completion of his Masters, began his 4-H career as an Extension educator until his retirement in 1998. An accident in the 4-H community inspired him to launch ATV Safety Programs. His program "Up From the Soil" was prominent for over 10 years and was a model for other states.

Recognizing the healing power of human interactions with horses, Bob and volunteers created the 4-H Therapeutic Riding Program in 1978. He served for years as an instructor and continues as a strong advocate. Bob has been active with the Eastern National 4-H Horse Round-Up Contest, serving as chairman of the communications contest and on the planning committee, and as one of the Horse Bowl moderators. In retirement, Bob still devotes many hours to 4-H, including support of the MD Horseman's Party that raises money for horse programs and scholarships, and helping MD 4-H faculty to develop and pilot a new On-Line Animal Husbandry/Quality Assurance program.

It has been exciting and very satisfying to be a 4-H agent and volunteer. When I saw a need in my county, I had the freedom to work with my amazing colleagues in extension to come up with a program to meet it. 4-H therapeutic riding program, ATV safety workshops, a creative writing project, a hunting and fishing club, a farm safety day camp are just some examples. At the same time, our superb volunteers helped maintain and expand the traditional 4-H experience for thousands of young people in our county clubs.
